GUIDELINES FOR LENT

Fasting and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fasting and Abstinence

This applies to all Catholics aged 18-59, inclusive. One full meal is permitted each day and two smaller meals may be taken which, combined, are less than a full meal. All Fridays, as well as Ash Wednesday, are days of Abstinence. This applies to all Catholics aged 14 and older. One may not eat meat (beef, pork, fowl, etc.) on these days, though fish (and seafood) is permitted.



WHY PRAY THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS FROM POPE FRANCIS

The Stations of the Cross are an ancient tradition in the Catholic Church going back to the fourth century when Christians went on pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Like many Catholic traditions, the Stations of the Cross can be rich, deep and meaningful, but at the same time we can lose sight of their significance and how to relate them to our everyday lives. They allow us to place our trust in him,. "The Cross of Christ contains all the love of God; there we find his immeasurable mercy. This love in which we can place all our trust, in which we can believe. Let us entrust ourselves to Jesus, let us give ourselves over to him, because he never disappoints anyone! Only in Christ crucified and risen can we find salvation and redemption."
