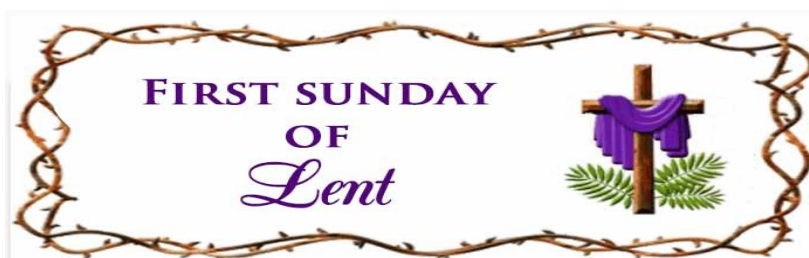

GUIDELINES FOR LENT

Fasting and Abstinence.

Ash Wednesday and
Good Friday are days of Fasting and Abstinence

This applies to all Catholics aged 18-59, inclusive. One full meal is permitted each day and two smaller meals may be taken which, combined, are less than a full meal. All Fridays, as well as Ash Wednesday, are days of Abstinence. This applies to all Catholics aged 14 and older. One may not eat meat (beef, pork, fowl, etc.) on these days, though fish (and seafood) is permitted.

Dear Friends in Christ,

Every year, during the First Week of Lent, we hear of Jesus making His journey into the desert. We can imagine the climate—hot during the day, and freezing at night. It is an experience of the extremes. In our Lenten journey, we, too proverbially enter into the desert with Christ. When we think of the early Church and the development of monasticism, we think of saints such as St. Anthony of the Desert or St. Benedict of Nursia—they longed for solitude because in solitude and silence, we are made to confront our weaknesses, to fight our interior battles, our sins against God. Lent is the Church's great retreat. If being a good Christian simply meant being "nice," then we could simply join any church, any organization, do some charitable work, be a decent person and return home. The true and authentic Christian journey has the cross at its forefront; it has the sacramental life at the core. Without God's grace we are nothing, there is no salvation. St. Paul writes that without charity we are like a "clanging gong." Charity means not "love" in the common sense, but the supernatural love of the Triune God. This is perfected in aestheticism and penance. If we want to be perfected, we must confront our own sins first headlong. We must enter into the desert willingly with Christ.
