
From the Pastor's Desk:

I am writing this Sunday's bulletin column from the seat of an airplane 30,000 feet above the Indian Ocean. By the time I land in Kansas City on Sunday evening, I will have literally traveled around the world, flying through Tokyo, Singapore, Diego Garcia, Bahrain, London and New Orleans! I also spent the bulk of my time just south of the equator where it's summer! My friend, Father Nicholas Reid, an Air Force chaplain in Anchorage, found it curious that I was called up for temporary duty in the tropics when Missouri is being pummeled by a seemingly endless series of winter storms. I know I should feel a little guilty about this. It is an honor to serve those who serve our Country, and it is a special privilege to be able to see the world while doing so. On Diego Garcia, I learned a lot of lessons which I hope to share with you in the coming months. The Island, an overseas territory of Great Britain, is a military installation comprised primarily of a U.S. Navy Support Facility, a few small U.S. Air Force commands, civilian Merchant Mariners, Filipino and American contractors and a tiny British military force which provides police and customs and immigration agents. With so many different people performing so many different jobs, Diego Garcia has a motto: "One Island, One Team, One Mission."

I was impressed with how so many folks wearing different uniforms, coming from different parts of the globe, worked together to accomplish one mission. In that, I saw a metaphor for the Universal Church. St. Paul has said it in words far more eloquent than mine, but I was privileged to see the concept played out in an unlikely place. Due to the remote nature of the place, and the infrequent flights to and from the island, there is a sense of being "stuck" (even if your command has granted you leave); a knowledge that there is a life outside this isolated place, but that attaining it is difficult to say the least and requires a tremendous amount of planning and patience. There is also a sense that, however remote, the mission of Diego Garcia is *not inconsequential* to the wider aims of the United States armed forces and our allies. What happens in our parish – and in our homes, for that matter – has implications for the mission of the wider church – including the diocese and the universal Church. This is at the heart of the recently announced diocesan vision: *One Family: Restored in Christ – Equipped for Mission*. It is my hope, over the next several months, seeking the guidance of parishioners, to develop plans by which our parishes can incorporate the wider diocesan vision in specific ways into our regular activities.


