

Dear Friends in Christ,

It is necessary to undergo many hardships to enter the Kingdom of God. This is what Sts. Paul and Barnabas tell us in the Acts of the Apostles when they describe their early evangelization efforts. Today, we are living in a post-Christian society much like the pagan world of our fathers in the Faith. Not only did they face their own religious establishment of the day, but also paganism or the rural local religions which believed in a variety of gods and goddesses. The situation we face to announce the Gospel is similar in many respects. The religious establishment of our day has become Pharisaical taking the actual Law of God in their own hands in some nations. One must not look further than some German Bishops who are seeking actively in many ways to reverse Gospel morality and make a religion based on how they live rather than following the words of Christ which teach us how to live. They have received many rebukes from other bishops' conferences in Europe as well as even American bishops who have written to them. In addition, we face modern paganism, even a resurgence of outward satanic symbols and practice in many of the establishment elite. This is no different than the Roman empire with its odd rituals or even the Barbarians and Celts of the North that Christian missionaries such as St. Patrick, St. Boniface or St. Martin of Tours encountered. To be a Christian today cannot be simply a wrote encounter with the Lord or even a habitual comfortable practice that we take for granted. To be a Christian today has indeed come full circle to exactly what the Apostle Paul exclaimed so many times when spreading the message of Christ in the world—it is necessary to undergo many hardships to enter the Kingdom of God.
