Dear Friends in Christ,

Today, we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost-the day on which the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles with the Blessed Mother present. It is in this mystery where we experience the birth of the Church with a capital "C." The Catholic Church does not see herself as a "Christian denomination" among others, a sort of flavor in the ice cream cart of religion. No. She sees herself espoused to her founder, Jesus Christ and she sees herself as visible not just made of anonymous believers. After all, Jesus was flesh and blood—would not His Church be visible as well?

One might well say that the when Christ was pierced on the cross the Church was conceived—blood and water ran from His Sacred Heart—Holy Baptism and the Eucharist, but now, at the Birth of the Church we see the Apostles given extraordinary gifts of the Holy Spirit in order to proclaim the Gospel to all nations. This *is* Christ's last command—to baptize all nations. God the Holy Spirit is the Comforter, the Advocate; He is what unifies the Church in belief and He is the One who sanctifies us. May our hearts burn with the same zeal of the Apostles.
