
One of the Catholic Charities' missions is to provide basic needs to families who can't afford essentials.

Dear Friends in Christ,

This weekend is the last "green weekend" in the liturgical calendar as the Solemnity of Christ the King is next weekend (the last Sunday in Time through the Year). And we are privileged to contemplate the inevitable—the end of the world, the Great Tribulation. While there are many prophecies out there today that claim this or that, the Tradition of the Church passed through the Holy Gospel and therefore, from the lips of the Lord Himself, we should always be pondering this day. We should live everyday as if it is our last on earth. We should live everyday as if the end of all things and the recapitulation of all things in Christ were imminent. Indeed, this is how the Apostle to the Gentiles taught the early Christians to live as if the eternity touching time were always near to us. When we put it off in the distance, we fail because we no longer live our lives in time with any longing, with any purpose—we languish in mediocrity instead of trying to live in greatness which is ultimately to spend our days in the Presence of the Almighty. At each and every Holy Mass, we get a glimpse of the Lord among us who is our Judge, who sits on the throne as the Lamb who was slain. The end is near—we have always believed this. This is nothing new to Christianity. To live the Christian life of penance, prayer and the sacraments is the key which binds us to Christ, Our Lord and Master, that when He does appear, we will be prepared with lighted torch ready to receive Him as the Bridegroom of our souls.
