

## Dear Friends in Christ,

As a reminder, next weekend, Bishop Johnston will join us for 8:00 am Mass as the celebrant. Please welcome him. In honor of his visit, the parish will make a donation in his name to Catholic Charities of St. Joseph. Please place your donation in the second collection basket next weekend for this intention (November 8).

This weekend (November 1) marks the last weekend of our annual no-work fundraiser. Most years we collect anywhere from \$12,000-16,000; our number this year so far has been \$7,900. It has been an odd and difficult year to say the least—thank you for supporting your parish during this trying time.

Today marks the Solemnity of All Saints. That brings up the question—what is heaven? So often, we have cartoonish images of winged cherubs and gates, and a whole boat load of jokes about St. Peter. Is Heaven not more than this? Heaven, ultimately, is union with the Blessed Trinity. In Heaven, there is no faith or hope, because these two virtues will totally be fulfilled with knowledge and possession of eternal life. Love or charity, is what will exist. In Heaven, each soul will be filled with the understanding of God insofar as one is able and that will make a human soul perfectly happy and fulfilled. At the same time, we will be in perfect union with others who are there, namely, the saints. This is the "communal" aspect of Heaven. United to one another and united in the Blessed Trinity. This relationship for Christians on earth is real because the bond of baptism and charity connects us with those who have union with God in heaven. We are intimately connected with the saints which is why we should pursue personal relationships with them. They have all of the human experience that we do in suffering, but have appropriated this correctly as to arrive at the glory of perceiving God and awaiting the final resurrection. The saints, filled with charity, are keenly interested in us. Just as we ask those around us to pray for us. God manifests His glory through the created order—we should ask the intercession of those who behold Him now.

Tomorrow is All Souls day. We will have a High Requiem Mass at St. Ann at 7:00pm. As a reminder, one can receive a plenary indulgence for the deceased who are in need of purification by visiting a cemetery and reciting pious prayers for them and praying for the Holy Father all under the normal circumstances (confession, Communion, no attachment to sin). This year, the Holy See has extended the Plenary Indulgence to the entire month of November.
