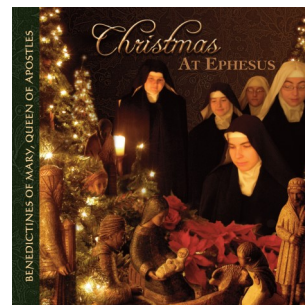

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Clement of Rome was the 3rd successor of St. Peter and reigned as pope during the last decade of the 1st century. The accounts of his martyrdom were composed about the 4th or 5th century. The Basilica of St. Clement in Rome, one of the earliest parish churches of that city, is probably built on the site of Clement's home. Clement's First Epistle to the Corinthians was preserved and widely read in the early Church. This letter from the church of Rome, authored by Clement to the church in Corinth, concerns a split that alienated a large number of the laity from the clergy. Clement deplores the unauthorized and unjustifiable division in the Corinthian church and urges unity. He cites the cause of the quarrel as "envy and jealousy."

COMMENT: Clement urged charity to heal the division in the church of Corinth, for "without charity, nothing is pleasing to God." Today many people in the Church have experienced polarization regarding worship, how we speak of God and other issues. May we modern Christians take to heart the exhortation of Clement:

"Charity unites us to God.... There is nothing mean in charity, nothing arrogant. Charity knows no schism, does not rebel, does all things in concord. In charity all the elect of God have been made perfect." (St. Clement, First Epistle to the Corinthians)
