



Dear Friends in Christ,

In this parable traditionally called "the widow's mite," we hear the story about how one woman gives everything she had (probably the dowry which would've been a coin in her hair) to the upkeep of the Temple while although the wealthy give "large sums of money," it is not a sacrificial gift—it is just whatever they have left over. How true this is! The essence of a gift is that there is nothing expected in return. It is freely given, not *quid pro quo* or give and take. A sacrificial gift is when we have to give something up ourselves for someone or something else. The essence of sacrificial giving is that it should hurt a little bit. This is something that has been by and large lost in our thinking especially when it comes to tithing. When we give to our parish, it is not a question of giving whatever is left over in our pocket or throwing whatever we have that we don't need. The widow teaches us to be intentional in our giving, to make it a part of our budget, a part of our lives, to think and pray about what we can do. The widow's mite doesn't ask for something in return, it is a free gift to the Temple and we are called to imitate her generosity.
