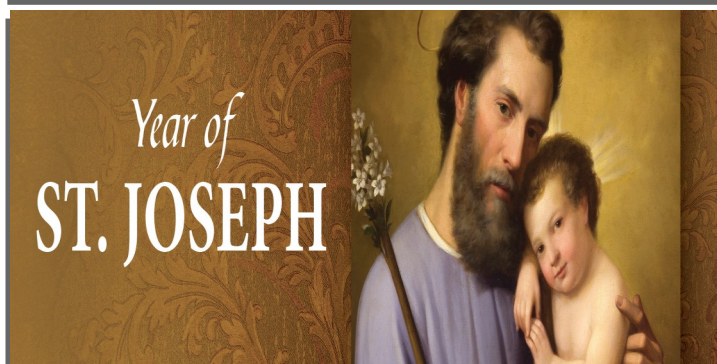

Dear Friends in Christ,

This month is dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary. While for many decades, the rosary unfortunately fell out of use in the lives of many Catholics, we have opportunity this month to delve deeper into its spirituality. While tradition tells us that Our Lady appeared to St. Dominic and gave him the rosary in the 13th century, the traditional three sets of mysteries add up to 150 Hail Mary's, the same number as the psalms. As the psalms are the prayer of Christ par excellence, it is understandable that Our Lady provided a way for us to ask her intercession while meditating on the principle mysteries of our Faith.

In the late 16th century, well after the Protestant revolt in Germany, the Turkish Muslim navy sought to invade Christian Europe. October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary because Pope St. Pius V implored all Christians to ask the Blessed Mother for protection as the Turkish navy outnumbered those of the Christians. Defeat, from a natural view, was certainly inevitable. Nevertheless, by the power of the Rosary, the invasion was staved off miraculously at the Battle of Lepanto with Christian forces (due to unseen weather patterns) were able to stave off the invaders. The victory of the Christian navy was attributed to Our Lady's miraculous intercession through the power of the Rosary.

We should not underestimate the power of the Rosary in our lives. We come to know the will of Christ in our lives, through the lens of the Most Perfect Disciple, the Blessed Mother Herself.
