
IT'S THAT TIME AGAIN! TO "GIVE FROM THE HEART"

Dear Friends in Christ,

"Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of You." These are the words of Sts. James and John. The Rich Young Man tries bartering with God and doesn't want to make full gift of himself. A couple of sentences before in this episode, Jesus is walking ahead of the disciples. Some are amazed and some are following behind because they are afraid. Arrogance is not meekness or strength. We can imagine these two Apostles, the same ones who wanted to burn out the Samaritans for not accepting Jesus, rushing up to ask to be in line first. To ask to be at God's right hand.
