Fr. Phil Luebbert passed away last week, as we approach November, please keep him in your prayers. On Saturday, November 2<sup>nd</sup>, I will rededicate the Kessler Cemetery, please contact Michael Fischer for more details. On November 3, in lieu of the normal Mass homily, we will hear about the annual Catholic appeal from a recording of Bishop Johnston.

This week's readings give us an interplay on the themes of mercy and justice. Again and again, we see that God is both. In his mercy, He hears the cry of the suffering, the destitute (materially and spiritually), but in His justice He stamps out evil and defends against those who unjustly persecute others. The Gospel teaches us a little about hope as well. The Pharisee who scrupulously practiced his religion had a loss of hope—he had presumption of his own salvation. In other words, he no longer really needed God (or so he thought). He thought his own actions were good enough and that He didn't need God for salvation. He didn't need to beg for God's mercy because he had everything "figured out." The publican, on the other hand, although he was not part of the First Covenant, understood far more about how he needed God's mercy to have eternal life. When we humble ourselves before God, we are able to become more like Him who is perfect. We must admit our failures, sins, and fallen state. It is then that we can experience God. When we make ourselves God like the Pharisee, we will never see him for we will be blinded with our own self-amusement. We must not lose hope in the life to come. We have not yet achieved it. The way to justification, as Jesus says, is to be like the publican and come before God humbled that we might be lifted up.


