

Dear Friends in Christ,

The Gospel today witnesses to what is most important in our lives—the moral choices that we make that have eternal consequences. In Catholic morality, the power of the human will along with the human intellect is respected by God. That is, we are not judged on a summation of choices that we make in life—mostly good versus mostly bad, or pretty darn good. Rather, when we make moral choices, we are saying something about what we believe to be true. There is a certain finality to our choices as well and when we choose material or false goods above what God requires, we are essentially choosing to worship a thing, a person or an action/inaction over God Himself. That is what a mortal sin is—the fixing of one's will on something/someone/some action that is supposed to be subordinated to God causing the individual to turn away from God, who is our supernatural end. When this happens, our will, in a certain way, is fixed. When Jesus is talking about Gehenna and cutting off limbs rather than sinning, He makes this point—that what should ultimately drive our conscience is not what others think, what we feel in the moment, or what looks good, but rather the Law of God. If our eternal destiny as baptized Christians is Beatitude or an eternal contemplation with God, if that is our supernatural end, then each moral choice that we make should be influenced by this fundamental truth.
