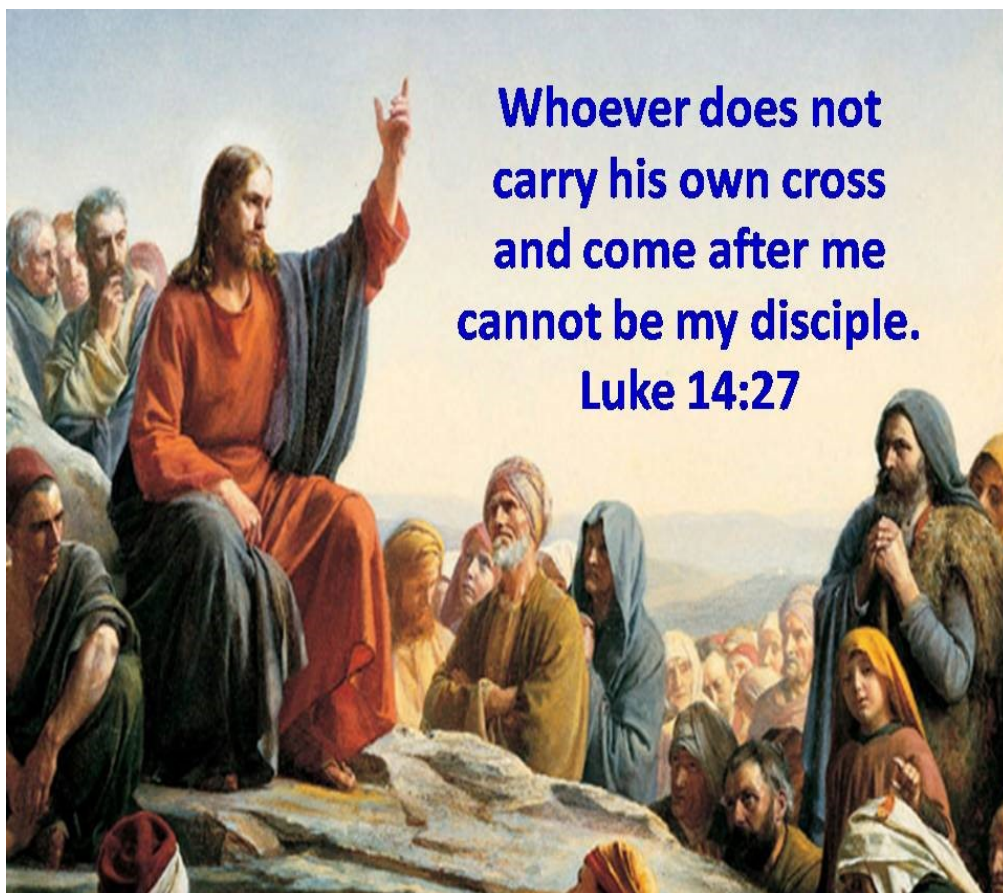

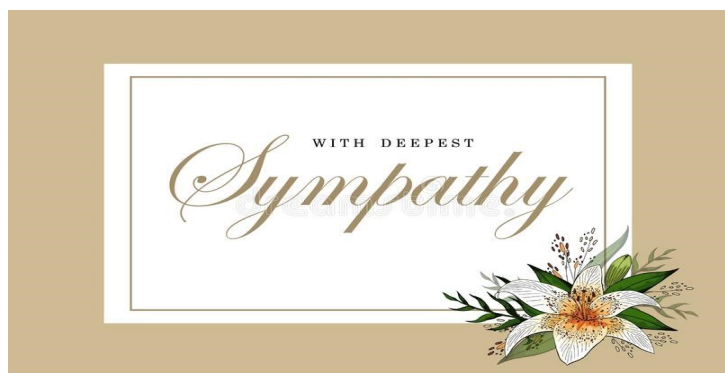

Dear Friends in Christ

What does it mean to lay a foundation? In other passages of the Gospel, Our Lord talks about rock and sand, about being vigilant, about being constantly prepared. St. Augustine, if I remember correctly, once said something about this topic. If we want a tower, we have to first start digging. Humility is related to the Latin root for soil *humus*. In the spiritual life, unless we dig deep first into our own lives, encounter where we have come up short, and try to mend that, we'll be just as blinded as those in the parable today who want a battle without checking the number of available soldiers or resources. We don't know when the Lord will return. To "let go" of that which we grip so tightly is to "sell all one's possessions" in a spiritual way for the Pearl of Great Price—Our Faith and ultimately union with the Blessed Trinity in the Kingdom.
