

BISHOP JOHNSON VISIT

OCTOBER 31ST, 2021 WE WILL BE HAVING A VISIT FROM BISHOP JOHNSON. WE ARE PLANNING ON HAVING A BRUNCH AFTER MASS AND THIS WILL BE A TIME FOR EVERY-ONE TO VISIT WITH HIM.

Dear Friends in Christ,

With one word, Jesus heals. At each and every Mass we, in a roundabout way, confess this truth in the words of the centurion—'And only say the word and my soul shall be healed." The power of the spoken word to transform (think of the consecration at Mass) and to give grace (sacramental grace) is poignant and noteworthy in examining this Gospel. We are taught today that words don't matter. The flip side of this is that actions don't matter either. Yet, here we see Jesus taking human saliva, putting His Divine Finger in the ears of the deaf man and saying—"Be thou opened!" Physical deformity, classically speaking, is an effect of Original Sin. Jesus came to heal us from all sins and the effects of Original Sin. which is not our fault, but which we have inherited from our first parents. The resurrection that is promised with our own matter (body) being transformed to be in the image and likeness of the Risen Lord has a foretaste here—there is no more deafness, muteness or blindness in Heaven. All is healed. Our personal sins, when they are forgiven here on earth with word and action (sacramental Penance), have no effect anymore in heaven or in the resurrection of the body. With one word, Jesus heals. What do our words mean? Are they empty? Do we mean what we say when we confess the Faith? Words do matter—they have a life of their own when they leave our mouth. The Eternal Word, Jesus Christ, walks among us. The spoken human word that comes from the mouth of the Eternal Word made flesh heals and brings us physical and spiritual health.
