Dear Friends in Christ,

This coming week, all of the priests of the diocese will be at the Lake of the Ozarks from Monday-Thursday for the annual Priest Convocation with Bishop Johnston. I will return on Thursday evening and we will have Mass on Friday morning along with adoration and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament at 12:00 P.M. Please pray for Fr. Phil Luebbert, our former pastor, who has been placed on hospice with cancer. I know he would appreciate your prayers or even a visit at the Jeanne Jugan center where he resides.

After Masses today, I invite you to take a tour of the sacristy and parish office. Please walk to the sacristy door by the parking lot and meet me there. So often, this is one of the rooms of a church building that many don't get a chance to see. I will speak more about this in the parish announcements.

The 29th of September is a special day in the Medieval Church calendar. Today was once called Michaelmas or the Feast of St. Michael the Archangel. It has been reduced in the modern calendar to the Feast of the Archangels—alas, the Sunday in Ordinary Time outranks it. At any rate, Michael's name in Hebrew means "Who is like God." Very often, Michael is pictured with a shield in his hand that says this Hebrew phrase in Latin "Quis ut Deus." St. Michael appears in Sacred Scripture in Jude and also in Revelation and is usually pictured as slaying Satan after Satan's choice to rebel against God. There is a very small difference between good angels and bad angels—the ultimate choice that is irrevocable for them is to be LIKE God (Good angels) or to want to BE God and overthrow His dominion (demons). That is the same choice that Adam and Eve had as well—to want to be like Him (to serve Him, know Him, to be like Him by worshipping Him); or what is evil—to rebel and grab at God's Dominion over creation and try to take His place.

In popular American culture, we often hear when someone dies—"My baby's an angel." Well, not really. Angels are essentially intelligences without bodies created by God that know things by their causes. They are infinitely more intelligent than the human mind. The typical human depiction of an angel with wings can perhaps be traced back to ancient Israel and the human depiction of the Seraphim that surrounded the ark. The wings represent their speed for they are not bound by space or time like we are or even a body. Praying to the angels is important. Just like saints, angels are intercessors before the throne of God with each angel being defined by his duty. St. Michael is known as a strong defense against all things demonic and evil. If you don't know the St. Michael prayer, please learn it. It is one of the most powerful prayers against evil in this world. The intercession of angels is real. When we celebrate the Feast of the Guardian Angels on October 2, I will write a bit more about how angels are traditionally divided and a bit more about what the role of the guardian angel is in our lives. 
